CALL TO CONFESSION

from Luther's "95 Theses"

[A Brief History of Confession]

"1. When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent," he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." As Christians, we are called to live a life of repentance. Let us join together in a posture of reform, as we confess our sins before God and one another:

PRAYER OF CONFESSION adapted (shortened!) from J. Knox's Book of Common Order (1564)

O Eternal God and most merciful Father,

We confess and acknowledge here, before your divine majesty, that we are miserable sinners.

We are conceived and born in sin and iniquity.

There is no goodness in us.

We rebel against your holy spirit;

we continually break your holy expectations and commandments.

And every time we do, we deserve through your just judgement, death and damnation.

O heavenly Father, we are disappointed with ourselves for the sins that we have committed against you.

We repent and humbly beg you:

Show your mercy upon us.

Forgive us all our sins.

Increase your Holy Spirit in us.

We acknowledge from the bottom of our hearts our own unrighteousness.

Moving forward we pray for change.

We pray that our sinful lusts and affections would die.

We pray that we would bear fruits acceptable to your will.

Grant us this, merciful Father, for Christ Jesus your Son's sake.

So be it.

PRAYER OF ILLUMINATION from "The Second Helvetic Confession (1561) - 5.001-5.002"

"We believe and confess the canonical Scriptures of the holy prophets and apostles of both Testaments to be the true Word of God, and to have sufficient authority of themselves, not of men. For God himself spoke to the fathers, prophets, apostles, and still speaks to us through the Holy Scriptures.

And in this Holy Scripture, the universal Church of Christ has the most complete exposition of all that pertains to a saving faith, and also to the framing of a life acceptable to God; and in this respect it is expressly commanded by God that nothing be either added to or taken from the same."

But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?" Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.


